

# 30-Day Relief Summary and Mid-term Response Outlook 9.14.21

## RELIEF PHASE: 30 Day Summary Impact Report as of 14 September 2021

- 322 Communities Served
- 195 Indigenous HaitiOne Partners (LEPs) Served
- 32.807 Families Served
  - o 29,692 Families Served with 3-week Food Kits
  - o 2,890 Families Served with Shelter Kits
  - o 26,845 Individuals Served with Hygiene Kits
- 224,969 Individuals Served
- Estimated 250+ facilitated MEDEVACs with HERO, Aerial Recovery Group, et al.

# **RECOVERY PHASE: 30-90 Day Reconstruction Initiative**

- <u>Relief Support</u>: HaitiOne will continue to process food, shelter, hygiene and other relief requests. We expect this to reduce in urgency and volume due to the tremendous efforts of partners to support and stabilize communities through the relief phase of this response. Partners may continue to share any urgent needs/requests through the <u>HaitiOne</u> <u>Emergency Assistance Request portal</u>.
- <u>School Reconstruction</u>: HaitiOne has been conducting school assessments for weeks in coordination with DPC, Min of Education, and local HaitiOne partners. Latest assessments show 1,060 school buildings have been damaged, and 171 schools have been destroyed representing 16% of all schools in the affected regions.
  - o Step 1: Temporary Structure: HaitiOne is aggressively working towards the target timeline from Min of Education to start schools on October 4<sup>th</sup>. The objective is to provide a temporary location for children to begin school as soon as possible.
  - Step 2: Permanent Structure: HaitiOne is working with the Min of Education to confirm design requirements and sourcing partners for long-term school reconstruction in permanent structures.
  - Step 3: MOH will review schools' eligibility for entrance into the ongoing nutrition program and education programs for additional ongoing support, and expects to provide ongoing education and nutrition assistance as needed.
- <u>Medical Support</u>: HaitiOne is continuing to work with MSPP and medical directors at the affected facilities to coordinate personnel, equipment, and supply reinforcement and support. Our goal is to facilitate re-construction where needed, and supply support so that these facilities come back stronger than before the earthquake. This is critical for the long-term strengthening and health security for the region.



## Field Mission Report: Sud, Grande Anse & Nippes

#### **Key Findings:**

- Assessment & Security Update:
  - Ongoing coordination with HaitiOne partners to identify secure routes into unserved and underserved communities. See WhatsApp Group <u>HaitiOneCriticalComms</u> for LIVE logistics updates.

  - Ongoing coordination with HaitiOne partners, local government, and the DPC in Grand Anse and Sud Departments to prioritize distributions and conduct assessments to serve those in greatest need.
  - The HaitiOne team is continuing to maintain a 24-hour turnaround on field assessment needs and distribution in coordination with DPC and local leadership (Mayors & Pastors).

  - Please see and review published distribution plan and needs for refreshed needs from major healthcare facilities in the affected regions.
  - Active coordination with Direct Relief Intl to support critical needs to 7 healthcare facilities in the Grand Anse and Sud Departments.
  - Ongoing movement and coordination with Jack Brewer Fndn and Haitian physicians to mobilize personnel support to healthcare facilities, and to expand their region of primary care through mobile medical clinics.

- Mobilization of field teams to Jeremie for ongoing support, coordination, and distributions in coordination with local HaitiOne partners.
