



DOMINICAN REPUBLIC | HOUSE FIRE

Zorada and Napoleon grieved as their home went up in flames. They lost absolutely everything—their home, furniture, and clothing—they were devastated and completely baffled at what to do next.

Zorada and Napoleon are a Dominican couple, living very close to Pastor Diony's church in the Dominican Republic. Pastor Diony and the majority of his congregation are Haitian. In the Dominican Republic, it's normal to experience division between Haitians and Dominicans. It's even common within churches, but not this church. Immediately when they saw the house engulfed in flames, they knew that they were positioned by God to be His hands and feet and to serve them in their time of need.

Within a matter of days, funds were raised by generous donors all throughout the Mission of Hope community whose hearts were moved to help. Construction started on their home the very next week after it had burned. Pastor Diony and several of his church members have volunteered their time over the past couple of weeks to help rebuild Zorada and Napoleon's home.



HAITI | SEED PROGRAM

In August, the Mission of Hope Agronomy team distributed 1680 kg (600 pots) of black beans to 200 farmers as part of the project to strengthen agricultural production in the villages of Turpin and Oranger. The Seed Program continues to provide hope, sustainable growth, and a significant impact for hundreds of farmers and their communities throughout Haiti.



HAITI | MARIE

"My name is Marie. I am 16 years old and I'm in the 6th grade. I have been going to my school since 2015. I live with my mother, father, and five siblings. The food I get at school from Mission of Hope is very important. It gives me the strength to study and allows me to grow; it's a huge blessing for my parents as well, because they do not have the means to feed me and my siblings properly. Without this food, it would be difficult for me to stay motivated during class to learn."



DOMINICAN REPUBLIC | VIVIANA

Hearing the news that there was a medical team coming to serve people in her community, Viviana muscled up the courage to go to the mobile medical clinic for help. Nine months pregnant, alone, and due to give birth within the next couple of weeks, Viviana was nervous.

When checking her vitals, it was clear that Viviana's blood pressure was very high. The medical professionals on our team were concerned about preeclampsia. Pastor Diony called his friend who is an OBGYN, and he agreed to see Viviana the very next morning. A church member of Pastor Diony's volunteered to drive her to the appointment so she could get the care she needed. It was a powerful picture of the church gathering around a scared mom and walking through life with her.

Our medical team was able to check in on Viviana after her appointment, and they happened to have the exact medicine she had a prescription for. She also excitedly said that she found out the baby is a boy and that her due date was just two weeks away!
