PASTOR PETITPHAR'S LEGACY

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Servant-hearted. Joyful. Kind. Humble. Courageous. These are all words that have been used to describe Pastor Petitphar, a pastor we had the honor to serve alongside for years in the Dominican Republic.

In the fall of 2022, Pastor Petitphar passed away unexpectedly. He lived an extraordinarily impactful life, filled with stories of serving his congregation, community, neighbors, and family. If you've served on a HopeGo trip to the Dominican Republic with Mission of Hope, you may have worked with Pastor Petitphar. Many have directly seen his and his precious wife's impact on the community. Pastor Petitphar was a Haitian man who experienced the trials of navigating life in the Dominican Republic, where racial tensions between the two cultures are high. The tension never stopped him from seeing every person as an imagebearer of God, full of dignity, value, and worth.

After his passing, several Mission of Hope staff went to be with his wife and reflect on the impactful life of her husband. While shocked and saddened by the loss of her husband, she had an unshakable faith that Petitphar was face-to-faith with Jesus—a place he'd fixed his hope on every day on earth.

The room was packed full on the day of Pastor Petitphar's funeral. Several pastors we partner with came to the funeral to honor their brother in Christ, Pastor Elbis, a Dominican pastor, went to the funeral in a community of predominately Haitians. In the current political climate, people were shocked to see a Dominican in a Haitian church—but Pastor Flbis didn't think twice about it. Pastor Petitohar was a brother. a friend, and a co-laborer in the Gospel. His life and his legacy were all unifying people around the truth of Jesus.

We rejoice as we continue to see reconciliation between Haitians and Dominicans across the island of Hispaniola and how our Church Advancement team is leading with excellence to bring to gospel to every man, woman, and child.

NUTRITION

FARM FIELD SCHOOL GRADUATION

HAITI

An important part of ministry at Mission of Hope is the agriculture program and the Farm Field School in Marmelade, Haiti. The farmers at our Farm Field School recently celebrated their fifth graduating class, consisting of 36 farmers! Each farmer received a certificate as a testament to their dedication during the two years of training. The graduation ceremony provides the opportunity to honor the farmers, involve the community, and celebrate the hard labor the farmers have poured into their crops.

The ceremony started with a procession of the recipients accompanied by a local orchestra. Celebration filled the streets and many from the community gathered, including local authorities, neighbors, friends, and families.




MADAME FLORE-ANNE

Technical School Enjoy learning more about Madame Flore's story:

It took me seven years of study at university to get where I am today—an Education Superintendent. I completed secondary school in my hometown at Camp-Perrin, and it was hard to leave my family, my brother, and my sister, to come to Port-au-Prince for university since I had never been away from home before. I had some financial obstacles, especially when getting my Master's Degree in Education, but I worked very hard and used almost all of my salary just to pay for my schooling.

The hardest part of my job is when our team works to have a plan for the school year, but then a political or health situation ruins the plan! The best part of my job is contributing to the education of the children of my country.



MEDICAL CARE

By meeting medical needs of those who are sick, people experience relief and hope in the midst of their pain. Physical healing often opens the door for spiritual conversations and is vital to the holistic life transformation taking place at Mission of Hope.



VIVIANA

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Hearing the news that a medical team was coming to serve people in her community, Viviana muscled up the courage to go to the mobile medical clinic for help. Nine months pregnant, alone, and due to give birth within the next couple of weeks, Viviana was nervous. The father of her baby was not in the picture. She had not once been seen by a doctor—nine months of no prenatal care. She didn't even know if she was having a baby girl or a boy.

When checking her vitals, it was clear that Viviana's blood pressure was very high. The medical professionals on our team were concerned about preeclampsia. They immediately knew that she needed to be seen by an OBGYN. Pastor Diony called his friend, who is an OBGYN, and he agreed to see Viviana the very next morning. A church member of Pastor Diony's

volunteered to drive her to the appointment so she could get the care she needed. It was a powerful picture of the church gathering around a scared mom and walking through life with her.

Our medical team checked in on Viviana after her appointment, and they happened to have the exact medicine she had a prescription for. She also excitedly said that she found out the baby was a boy and that her due date was just two weeks away!

The anxieties and the health problems she was having started to subside, and her face brightened. She knew that God cared for her. She shared that she had given her life to Christ years ago but had not been living for Him. Right there at the mobile medical clinic, she rededicated her life to Christ and committed to raising her son to know and love Jesus, too. Praise God for the courageous woman that Viviana is! Please pray that God protects her and her son and that they experience His provision each and every day.

DISASTER RESPONSE

Mission of Hope has been one of the first to step in and meet needs during times of disaster, and this year was no different. Our partner network makes for efficient and effective distribution, alongside the local church, to get critical aid to those who need it most.




HIGUEY

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

This fall, Hurricane Fiona hit the Dominican Republic and caused widespread damage on the eastern side of the island. Mission of Hope responded quickly and through rapid assessments determined hundreds of families in the community of Higuey were in need of aid to help them rebuild during that difficult time.

In coordination with the local government, local churches, pastors, businesses, and organizations, Mission of Hope distributed food, hygiene kits, tarps, and clothing donations to those who were hit hardest and in the most vulnerable situations.

THE NEED

GET INVOLVED Right now the most critical need in Haiti is food. Due to rising inflation, political instability, and the devaluation of the Haitian gourde, 4.4 million people in Haiti are in a food insecurity crisis. Now food is more expensive, and their money is worth less. One mother told us it feels like her bread is shrinking.

Although we serve over 116,000 meals to students in our nutrition program every day, there are over 73,000 kids on our waiting list at the start of 2023 who are also in desperate need.

We believe the current reality in Haiti doesn't have to be this way.

It only costs about \$10/month to provide one hot, nutritious meal every day.


For many, this will be the only meal they have. Whether you can provide meals for one child or 1,000, you'll be making a real difference in real people's lives.




